Travel paperless from Kochi airport with DigiYatra from Tuesday

Facility to be launched at six more airports, including Mumbai and Kochi, in August

MAKING travel more convenient for passengers, Cochin International Airport Limited (CIAL) will begin the DigiYatra facility at the airport starting Tuesday. CIAL has been running the paperless entry with a face recognition facility as a trial with limited airlines since February 2023.

"Starting Tuesday, the DigiYatra facility will be operational

at Kochi airport. Passengers using DigiYatra can clear the security check-in at one go. The software was developed by CIAL's IT department," said a CIAL official. CIAL has already started DigiYatra facilities for passengers with Air India, Air Asia, and Vistara airlines. From August 15, all passengers having the app can utilise the service," the official added.

Govt nod to start work on Kakkanad metro station

THE delay in starting construction work of the metro station at Kakkanad Junction has been resolved with the state government giving permission to start the work.

Ever since the KMRL decided to construct a station at Kakkanad Junction questions were raised about the safety and privacy of the inmates of the children's home situated nearby.

The order issued by Santhosh Kumar V T, Additional Secretary, however, directed the KMRL to carry out the construction only after ensuring the safety of the children's home near the site.

As per the order, KMRL will be allowed to acquire only 13.92 cents of land for the station, and no windows should be erected on the metro station facing the children's home. "The construction of the new underground water tank at the home has to be completed before starting the construction work on the metro station. Along with this, the construction of a 17-fthigh boundary wall between the proposed metro station and home has to be completed," the order reads.

The order also directed the KMRL to maintain the existing entrance

gate as it is, and only relocate the security cabin.

Meanwhile, a meeting convened by district collector NSK Umesh, the other day, directed the police to ensure patrolling on the premises until the completion of the metro station work. "PWD has been designated as the nodal agency to monitor the work. The collector also directed KMRL to ensure the safety of the children's home," said a revenue officer.

55-year-old run over by container lorry, dies

A 55-YEAR-OLD man died after being run over by a container lorry at Vallarpadam on Friday night. The deceased is Sibi, of Mulayukad.

The accident occurred on the compound of Gateway Distriparks Kerala Ltd (GDKL) around 8.30pm. Mulavukkad police have registered a case of culpable homicide against the lorry driver after it was found that he was under the influence of liquor.

According to police, the lorry driven by the accused reached GDKL to load goods on Friday night. After loading goods, the accused negligently moved the lorry ahead without noticing Sibi standing in front of the vehicle.

Though Sibi was rushed to the hospital, he succumbed to injuries. Police will record the arrest of the driver soon. The body was handed over to relatives after a postmortem examination.

10 years after heart transplant, Sruthi leads 'beautiful' 2nd life

10 YEARS AGO, on this day (August 13, 2013), 24-year-old Sruthi was in a hopeless state as she was suffering from cardiomyopathy, a condition that affects the heart muscles. However, on World Or-

gan Donation Day (August 13) in 2013, a call from Dr Jose Chacko changed her life and now she is living a healthy life. 34-year-old Sruthi became the first person in the state to live for 10 years after a heart transplant surgery.

The decision of Kottayam native Lalichan's family gifted her with a second life. Lalichan was declared brain dead at the Kottayam Government Medical College Hospital. His family immediately decided to donate his organs. Within an hour, his heart was transported to Lisie Hospital from Kottayam. "I am grateful to

the family of Lalichanchettan. I was struggling and did not expect to live a happy life. Their decision to donate his organs gave me this life," said a teary-eyed Sruthi. The transplantation surgery was conducted under the leadership of Dr Jose

Chacko Periyapuram. Sruthi, who came back to normal life after the surgery, is now working as a beautician. At the event organised by Lisie Hospital to celebrate her second life, Sruthi

thanked everyone who helped her out. "The doctors and nurses gave me much confidence. Even my neighbours helped me financially. I am grateful to each one of them," she said. Elsamma, Lalichan's sister listened to her brother's heartbeats after 10 years at the event. The event was attended by actress Anna Ben, Dr Jose Chacko Periyapuram, HOD of the department of cardiothoracic surgery and Fr Paul Karedan, di-

rector of Lisie Hospital.
